From the Nursing Team

The Nurses would like to take this opportunity to remind all patients that if you get an invite to come in and see them with regards to your diabetic checks, health heart checks or anything else, they would like you to take up the offer. These consultations are free and are for your best health interests. Remember early detections of any problems, can dramatically change an outcome.

Our Nurse Ann-Marie is undertaking her postgraduate in Nurse Prescribing, she is nailing her assignments already getting two 'As" and passing her first exams. Quite an achievement for a person who works and is bringing up two young children.

Our Nurse Manager, Alverie, has been nominated at the DHB awards for her work with her diabetic patients using the new Free Libre Sensor. This has been hugely successful with a lot of patients who are now using this way to test their blood glucose levels. Alverie is leading the way in the Hutt Valley with this new initiative.

We are incredibly proud of the nomination and wish her well at the awards on November 18th.

Our lovely Nurse Izzy will finish her graduate programme with us in November and we wish her well in the next step of her working career.

Change to Child vaccine schedule

From the 1st October 2020 we now have a new vaccine visit at 12 months. There are no new vaccines being offered but it does mean your child will be fully immunised for measles by the 15-month visit. There is no longer a MMR vaccine given at the 4 year old vaccine visit.

If you child is coming up to 12 months old or just over 12 months old, please book them with the nurses for their 12 month vaccine visit if you haven't already done so.

If you child is 15 months to 4 years old, So that your child doesn't miss a MMR dose please book your child in for a catch up MMR vaccine with the nurses.

Preferred Pharmacy

There is a new set up in our computer system that allows your GP to send your script directly to your preferred pharmacy. This means whether you are in a consultation or ordering a repeat, your prescription will be waiting for you at the pharmacy. This saves your time waiting for it to be processed as it should be ready waiting for you.

MyIndici – patient health portal.

Another small push for you to register on the patient portal if you haven't already done so. February next year we will be opening our patients notes, so that you can see what the GP or Nurse has written during your consultation.
